

PROGRAM STATUS REPORT TO THE FAR WEST DIVISION
Community College Program Nancy Stromswold, Coordinator
August 4, 2012 SUMMER Division Meeting

GOALS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR 2011-2012 SEASON

- **DONE** Continue a program that helps community colleges fill their CAP and patrollers receive credit for their training in the classroom, on the hill, and at conferences more than 28 hours. The FWD contract compensated the CA CC System \$13,582.50 by filling seats that would have otherwise gone empty. (\$18 per student for 28 hour class; \$108 per student for 125 hour class.)
- **IN PROCESS** Sign annual contract with the SBRPSTC and Columbia for 2012-2013 by 7-1-12. Note: The cost per unit will increase from \$36. to \$46. per credit effective 9-1-2012. (\$23 for 28 hour class; \$138. for 125 hour class.) 28 hours x 1.75 per contact hour - \$23. to CC - 20% to FWD = \$20.80 per student
- **DONE** Increase the number of California patrols and qualified students participating. Mt. Shasta included in CCP. SoCal Region has two Supervising Instructor packets (S. Thorsted)
- **STATUS-QUO** Add 100 hour on-the-hill candidate training class for qualified student candidates. The process of accrediting a new course is time intensive and costs money. It is not a priority for Community College System to approve an "out of the box" course for a small group of students.
- **DONE** All classes closed and funds received by FWD.

South Bay Regional Public Safety Training Consortium contract (NorCal, ESR and MLR patrols)

- 28 hour ½ credit Skills and Knowledge class (annual recertification for patrollers) = 393 students
62 Sugar Bowl, 63 China Peak, 41 Donner Ski Ranch, 13 Soda Springs,
46 Heavenly, 48 Northstar, 38 Sierra at Tahoe, 23 Homewood, 11 Boreal, 48 Mt. Shasta
- 125 hour 3 credit OEC class (for candidates) = 43 students
12 Donner Ski Ranch (Sac), 19 China Peak (Fresno), 12 ESR (7 East Bay, 5 Truckee)

Columbia College contract (MLR patrols)

- EMS 170 Basic Patroller Mod A = 33 students
33 Bear Valley

GOALS FOR 2012-2013 SEASON

- Continue the program. No guarantees the CA State Legislature will continue to fund, but the FWD will proceed as if there will be a program.
- Resign annual contract with the SBRPSTC and Columbia by 7-1-13.
- Continue to increase the number of California patrols participating (see below)
- Applications and grade sheets submitted to the CC by the deadlines.
- MOUs and Financial Accounting forms submitted by participating patrols by 7-1-13.
- Continue to work the CC to add 100 hour on-the-hill candidate training class.
- Appoint new FWD Community College Coordinator; transition training this season.

PLAN

- Communicate regularly with our community college liaisons.
- Communicate with patrols in California about the benefits and process of the CC program.
- Assist Supervising Instructors registering students, documenting hours, submitting paperwork.

Resources requested/needed to execute Plan – None \$75.00 postage, print cartridges

- To participate in the FWD Community College Program, a patrol must have

1. a qualified Supervising Instructor “Boarded” by the State of California CC System, willing to do the paperwork, and be on site during the course; Assistant Instructors are recommended
2. a MOU signed by the Patrol Representative and submitted to the FWD Treasurer.
3. Registration applications for each qualified student submitted by the deadline
4. Attestation Grade Sheet to document hours and P/F submitted by deadline at the end of the course.
5. Complete an annual Community College Funds Expenditure Report and send to FWD Treasurer.
6. To receive funds from participation in 2010-2011, the FWD Treasurer must receive
 1. Annual Community College Accounting of Funds
 2. Annual MOU signed by Patrol Representative and Division Director
 3. Annual Region accounting from Region Treasurer
