

## Far West Division OEC Supervisor Program Plan 2012-2013

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- Mission/Objective:
  - To facilitate the development of the best Outdoor Emergency Care (OEC) training, testing and quality assurance program for all FWD patrollers, OEC Instructors, and Instructor Trainers. Improve alignment, communication, and to better share ideas between National, Division, Region, and local area OEC protocols. Support and provide the FWD OEC Instructor Trainers the tools in which to build and maintain a knowledgeable and experienced Instructor base within each Region.
- Objectives:
  - Work from the individual Patrol level to the National level towards identification and development of improved program delivery and content.
  - Increase the understanding and relationship between ITs, Instructors and Mentors.
  - Provide OEC program and Senior OEC support to each Region in the FWD.
  - Travel to two Regions to attend local training activities as well as provide OEC updates from the National Office.
  - Encourage all patrollers to become more involved with some of the Division and Region sponsored educational events like the Tri-advisory in Yosemite or MLR and ESR sponsored Davis training day.
  - Represent the best interests of the FWD OEC at the National OEC Supervisor’s meeting.
  - Continue working with the National OEC Committee on standardized OEC practical finals, improving the written OEC final, establishing IT training guidelines and contributing to OEC 5th edition.
- The Plan:
  - On a three year rotating seasonal schedule, meet with each Region and individual hill OEC Instructor and Instructor Trainers to foster and mentor new and existing instructor trainers and instructors. The focus of these visits will be to standardize the way in which we as the FWD deliver and the metrics used to evaluate the Quality of our OEC program.
  - Work closely with each individual Region OEC Administrator to establish a Division standardized training and delivery program as per the National OEC guidelines.
  - Train and deliver the new standardized National mandated Senior Training/Evaluators program throughout the FWD. This will begin at the National OEC supervisors meeting in Denver at the end of Sept. 2012 where the Senior OEC TE course will be rolled out. Those that attend and successfully complete the course will then take the lead in developing Senior OEC TEs back at their respective Regions and Patrols.
  - Establish and make available to all Regions, a current list of those individuals within the FWD who are Qualified Senior OEC TEs that are available for Region sponsored Senior OEC events.
  - Provide the “continuing education” certification clinics required to sustain OEC instructorship.
  - Continue working with all of the Regions within the FWD to very specifically detail the responsibilities and the Requirements to maintain OEC Instructor and Instructor Trainer certifications. This has been a much overlooked portion of the NSP P&P in the past and will be a focus of QA for the next 3 years.
  - To provide the opportunities within each Region and Hill for every OEC Instructor/IT to achieve at least the minimum teaching/QA and re-certification responsibilities mandated through National.
