**SEASON HIGHLIGHTS — total classes — total participants**

116 Transportation Courses were registered in the FWD during an absolutely abysmal snow year – a wonderful testament to the OET Instructors in our Division! The final number exceeded my mid season expectations by a considerable amount, thanks only to course duplications popping out of our national dbase faster than I can reduce my expectations for ever getting any usable data out of Lakewood.

**GOALS FOR COMING SEASON:**

Get back on track for continued development of the Transportation Program in the FWD.

- Complete the LVSSR visit originally scheduled for last December
- Focus point on Transportation IT roles & responsibilities

**ISSUES and RESOLUTIONS:**

This year – for the first time since I took this position in 2010 – I do not have the ability to see or affect the closure of overdue Transportation courses in our Division – which, of course, is a SIGNIFICANT portion of any Supervisor’s job. Begun in September of 2013, the upgrade to IMIS15 has to date resulted in a net LOSS of usable data available to the Program Supervisors and – combined with the nearly complete lack of communication regarding system improvements and time lines - will have a negative effect on virtually everyone in the NSP Education line, and we will lose key people because of our inability to address these issues.
