**SEASON HIGHLIGHTS — total classes — total participants**

We registered a total of 100 Transportation Courses in the Division in 2015. Those courses included:

22 Instructor Continuing Education events

21 Toboggan Refreshers

15 Patroller 101 courses

15 Senior events

And were intended to serve a total of 1254 patrollers.

Other highlights included a long overdue trip to LVSSR, participation in the single most successful Powderfall event the NSP has ever run, and a season end trip to the Pacific Northwest Division's Nuts & Bolts Training event at Mt. Hood, Oregon

**GOALS FOR COMING SEASON:**

Continued support of Regional ICE events; in-season targeting of areas of concern with personal visits and instructional support.

Develop two new Region OET Administrators.

Instructor Trainer support and verification of assigned duties.

**ISSUES and RESOLUTIONS:**

Data base breakdowns in Lakewood have once again presented a significant barrier to continued development of the Transportation Program nationally. The new course offerings recently created by the Transportation Committee, along with the descriptions of those courses, remain largely invisible to the NSP membership.

Lack of access to certain reports, notably delinquent courses, has once again handcuffed Division Program Supervisors from being effective in their required duties.

A resolution may be available mid-season 2016 if IT development in Lakewood remains on track.
